He has successfully served as an expert witness for the Arizona nursing home industry in the passage of several tort reform bills. These bills have positively impacted all Arizona healthcare providers by reducing the statute of limitations from seven years to two years, normalizing punitive damages, and eliminating the attorneys' fees provision in cases filed under the Adult Protective Services Act.

He also maintains an active alternative dispute resolution practice, focusing on mediating tort claims, including those involving medical malpractice, elder abuse, wrongful death and personal injury.
